One of the challenges I set the kids (and myself) was to change our language, and then to see how it might change our attitudes as well... I have been delighted by the impact it seems to be having on all of us.... Allow me to share just a few of the responses I've had over the past couple of days. They are just beautiful! So proud of these kids.

"When I was playing on my iPad, it was time

for breakfast and I was about to say, 'Oh come on! Do I **HAVE** to have breakfast!? But then I said to myself... 'Oh wait, I'm lucky because I **GET** to have breakfast."





"Last night, I said, '*I* **GET** to have dinner', instead of '*I* **HAVE** to have dinner' because I realised some kids don't even have dinner and I am lucky to have food to eat for dinner."

"I was about to say, 'Oh Mum... Do I HAVE to take the rubbish out today?' But then I said, 'No actually... 'I GET to take the rubbish out.'

Have a try...
